Day 3 Reflections

- Make decisions/policies that are flexible, robust and resilient and work over wide range of conditions.
- Examples include no regrets/low regrets, incremental investments, maintain options, diversify portfolio.
- Decision support tools can help organize complex information & analyze options.
- Consider multiple futures, not one single future. Stress test your organization's plans.
- Seek robust plans that perform well over many futures, not optimal plans designed for a single, best estimate of the future.
- Make plans flexible and adaptive, which often makes them robust.
- Many challenges exist to move climate change planning forward, but there are solutions.
- Building dialogue and planning to implementation is time-intensive but essential. Know your audience and adjust your message accordingly.
